Explanations to select answers

- **2. (A)** Although coffee happens to be a material noun and cannot have a plural as such, here it is used as used in common parlance, where the 'cup/glass of', is understood or is silently present. As in most printed/written menu, it is mentioned as . . . one coffee for xyz amount.
- **8. (D)** 'Every' is used with singular nouns to refer to all members of that group when you are referring to a group. 'Each' is used when referring to one of two or more things, when you are thinking about them separately.
- **10. (B)** 'Otherwise' is used to state the result that would be if something did not happen or if the situation were different. 'Or' is used normally when you are not sure about the other possibility.
