= $5 + 5 = 10$ apples
Before selling total apples
= $(36 + 10) = 46$ apples
 $46 \div 2 = 23$ apples
Ritu should have 6 apples less than Laura
Laura = $23 + 3 = 26$
Ritu = $23 - 3 = 20$
Now subtract sold apples
Ritu = $20 - 5 = 15$

$\square \rightarrow 6 \begin{cases} D \rightarrow 2 \\ W \rightarrow 4 \end{cases}$

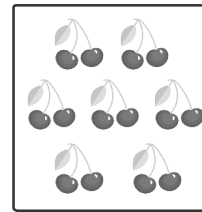
12. (B) Find the number of girls:

$$\begin{aligned} 10 \text{ tens } 0 \text{ ones} &= (10 \times 10) + 0 \\ &= 100 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} 100 \text{ tens } 0 \text{ ones} &= (100 \times 10) + 0 \\ &= 1000 \end{aligned}$$

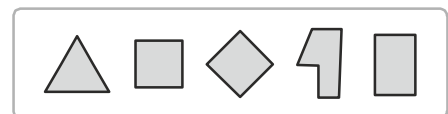
\therefore 10 tens 0 ones is equal to 1 hundred.
