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Explanations and answers to select questions

01. The four types of genders as recognised by English grammar as of today, are : Masculine, Feminine, Common and Neuter. The first three are for animals or living creatures and neuter is for inanimate or lifeless things/objects. The common gender refers to the names of species, such as eagle, crow, crocodile, where the gender cannot be easily known or the names of communities such as Hindus, Sikhs, where all genders are covered. So, option 'C' is the correct answer.
09. 'Everywhere' is not an adjective. Option 'B' is the correct answer. All questions are framed within the purview of Oxford English Learner's Dictionary, 8th edition published in 2014.
14. Here, the contextual meaning is what a student has to consider in order to guess the correct word for the blank. And 'industrious' fits in well as can be seen by the following words 'and thus worked very hard'. (This is not about collocations. Moreover, collocation is a combination of words that happens very often than would happen by chance; but that is not a rule.) So, option 'B' is the correct answer.
26. In case of reciprocal pronouns, 'each other' is used when reference is made only to two persons. And when it is made to more than two persons, (as in here, 'staff of a bank' which will naturally be more than two in number), we need to use 'one another'. So, option 'C' is the correct answer.
43. Here the word 'next' clearly refers to the word 'point' (which is understood though not expressed). Hence in 'next point', 'next' is an adjective and so, option 'A' is the correct answer.

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
