Explanations and answers to select questions

- 03 Option (C) is the correct answer. There is no word as 'Fein'.
- 07 Option (A) is the correct answer. It is Faction = Fact+fiction.
- 15 Option (C) is the correct answer. The four words are: Myth, Thy, Try and My.
- 23 Option (C) is the correct answer. When the subject is made up of nouns joined by 'or', the verb agrees with the last noun. So, here it needs to agree with 'brothers', and hence option (C).
- 26 Option (D) is the correct answer. The subject 'none' here refers to a plural, 'boys'. And so its reference point being a plural, 'none' takes a plural verb.
- 27 Option (A) is the correct answer. The phrase 'as well as' is not a conjunction and neither does it work as one. That leaves the subject 'Lily' a singular, and hence option (A).
- 28 Option (D) is the correct answer. The blank needs a pronoun that can represent the action of sending a gift by Manu to Raj and *vice versa*, reciprocating the action. So, we use a reciprocal pronoun. When such action takes place among more than 2 persons, we use the reciprocal pronoun 'one another' and when between 2 (*as here*), we use 'each other'.
- 29 Option (A) is the correct answer. The given sentence is a second conditional with its pattern: 'If + past simple (got), would + infinitive (save)'.
- 30 Option (C) is the correct answer. Theology is the study of religion; phenology is of climate.
- 33 Option (D) is the correct answer. When the reporting verb is in the present tense (says here), there is no change in the tense of the reported speech, though prepositions and pronouns change as per the rules.
- 34 Option (C) is the correct answer. Only the tense of the universal truth remains unchanged.
- 48 Option (B) is the correct answer. Irony is a literary device that relies on the difference between expectation and outcome. An oxymoron is a figure of speech where two words of opposite meaning are used together.
