Explanations and answers to select questions

- 03 Option (D) is the correct answer. It is pronounced as 'sow' like 'tow'.
- 04 Option (B) is the correct answer. They are: Port, Post, Pots and Pros.
- 07 Option (C) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is: Occurrence.
- 09 Option (A) is the correct answer. It is Bash = Bang+Smash.
- 23 Option (D) is the correct answer. The conjunction 'since' means 'because' or 'as'.
- 25 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'Many a student' is used with a noun and a verb in the singular. 'Many students' takes the students collectively, 'many a student' takes them singly for the verb.
- 26 Option (C) is the correct answer. For keeping the structure of the sentence parallel, two gerund phrases need to be used.
- 27 Option (B) is the correct answer. The sound produced by the first syllable of a word decides the indefinite article it takes. In case of 'european' the sound produced is that of a consonant as in 'you', so article 'a'; in case of 'asian' the sound produced is that of a vowel as in 'aim', so article 'an'.
- 32 Option (B) is the correct answer. Development in a city/town/village leads to a sprawl and so does famine to malnutrition.
- 33 Option (A) is the correct answer. That is the only one which is not a bird of prey.
- 44 Option (B) is the correct answer. We can have only apostrophe after the last letter 's' of a singular noun only if the last syllable of that noun begins and ends in 's' as in 'Moses'.
