## Explanations and answers to select questions

- 01 Option (B) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is : Beginning.
- 04 Option (C) is the correct answer. It is : Jour-ney. All others are with 3 syllables each.
- 05 Option (B) is the correct answer. 'Gallows' is the same spelling for singular and plural.
- 06 Option (A) is the correct answer. It is the past tense of 'lie', meaning, 'to put yourself in a flat or horizontal position so that you are not standing or sitting'.
- 07 Option (C) is the correct answer. In addition to being an adverb, meaning, 'generally, when you consider everything', it, as a noun, means 'a loose coat worn over your clothes to prevent them from getting dirty', such as those worn in garages and labs.
- 09 Option (D) is the correct answer. Modem = Modulator+Demodulator.
- 13 Option (D) is the correct answer. The word 'sew' is pronounced as 'so', like 'low'.
- 15 Option (B) is the correct answer. The five words are : Dire, dive, ride, vide and vied.
- 16 Option (C) is the correct answer. The catch (all the fish caught) of a fisherman.
- 25 Option (C) is the correct answer. Indefinite article before a word is decided on the sound the first syllable of that word produces. In 'RTC', 'auto' and 'undergraduate', the sound produced is that of a vowel as in 'are', 'author' and 'another' respectively, so the article 'an'; and in 'one-way' it is of a consonant as in 'won', so the article 'a'.
- 26 Option (D) is the correct answer. The word 'only' compels the use of 'some'.
- 29 Option (B) is the correct answer. The structure can be parallel only if we use the 'third noun' like 'housing' that does not demand any article before it.
- 32 Option (C) is the correct answer. An 'eraser' is a companion/part of a pencil and so is a 'nib' of a 'pen'.
