**Explanations and answers to select questions**

- 02 Option (B) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is 'Millennium'.
- 03 Option (C) is the correct answer. It is 'shaved', not 'shaven'.
- 09 Option (D) is the correct answer. Option (C) 'sea' is a 'homophone' of 'see'.
- 14 Option (C) is the correct answer. The two types are : 'cardinal' and 'ordinal'.
- 23 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'have' because of 'we' and 'sent' because of 'already'.
- 24 Option (A) is the correct answer. 'Neither' has already provided the negation.
- 26 Option (C) is the correct answer. In case of 'Himalayas' the speaker is referring to a mountain range in particular and so 'The' needs to be used at the first blank. All rivers, mountains, valleys with names, are thus preceded by article 'the'. In case of the second blank, the speaker is using a superlative degree 'largest', which, as a rule has to be preceded by article 'the', hence 'the' should be used.
- 31 Option (C) is the correct answer. If you 'read', you get 'knowledge'. If you 'work', you get experience'.
- 32 Option (D) is the correct answer. The order of adjectives is wrong. The adjective of colour (brown) should appear after the adjective of general description (lovely).
- 33 Option (C) is the correct answer. Each of the other three options expresses a framework of future actions planned, based on a 'calender' which provides a layout of dates and days. But 'calendar' by itself does not contain/express any plan for a future action.
- 34 Option (A) is the correct answer. When the reporting verb (*'says' here*) is in present tense, there is no change in the tense of the reported speech.
