Explanations and answers to select questions

- 01 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'Vase' is pronounced same as 'Class'.
- 03 Option (D) is the correct answer. The syllables are: Qui-et. All other words are single-syllabled.
- 06 Option (B) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is: Caffeine.
- 08 Option (C) is the correct answer. They are: Whet, With and Whit.
- 10 Option (B) is the correct answer. It is Flare = Flame+Glare.
- 17 Option (C) is the correct answer. Deer and swan are of common gender. Buck is of masculine.
- 24 Option (D) is the correct answer. The blank is a part of the subject 'My brother and ______'. So we need to use a pronoun at the blank that can serve as the subject of a sentence (nominative case).
- Option (D) is the correct answer. The phrase 'along with' is not a conjunction and neither does it work as one. Hence the verb needs to agree only with a singular subject 'Neetu'.
- 27 Option (C) is the correct answer. The adjective 'poor' is preceded by 'the', indicating the lot, 'poor people', a plural and so the plural verb.
- 28 Option (B) is the correct answer. The sound produced by the first syllable of a word decides the indefinite article it takes. In case of 'SMS' and 'M.A.' the sound produced is that of a vowel as in 'ace' and 'aim' respectively, so 'an'. The presence of 'our' does away with the requirement of an article.
- 30 Option (D) is the correct answer. To shadow someone is to trail and to disgrace is to shame someone.
- 31 Option (B) is the correct answer. When the reporting verb is in the present tense (*says* here), there is no change in the tense of the reported speech, and so does 'now', as it is the adverb.
- 32 Option (D) is the correct answer. Only the tense of the universal truth remains unchanged.
- 43 Option (C) is the correct answer. The six topics of manners quoted are: seeking permission (knocking/borrowing), self-help (cleaning after personal use), littering (public nuisance), talking (aloud/foul), holding door (letting in/not slamming) and right of way (allowing to exit/alight first).
