Explanations and answers to select questions

- 04 Option (C) is the correct answer. Its homophone is 'tern'.
- 09 Option (B) is the correct answer. Its singular is 'opus'.
- 11 Option (C) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is : Desperate.
- 14 Option (C) is the correct answer. The three other words are : hardest, hatreds and trashed.
- 21 Option (B) is the correct answer. Options (A) and (D) cannot be used because of the presence of article 'a' before the blank.
- 24 Option (B) is the correct answer. The phrase 'together with', is not a conjunction and neither does it work as one. That leaves the verb only a singular subject (Ram) to agree with.
- 27 Option (B) is the correct answer. The first syllables of 'SMS' and 'interesting' produce vowel sounds as in 'ace' and 'inner' respectively, so 'an' for them and 'the' for cinema, it being a particular one, the one near the school.
- 29 Option (C) is the correct answer. A cent is a unit of a dollar, a troop is a unit of a battalion.
- 30 Option (B) is the correct answer. Only that can create the pattern of the 3rd conditional, If + past perfect (had arrived) . . . would + have + past participle (caught).
- 31 Option (C) is the correct answer. As the reporting verb is in the future tense (*will say*), there is no change of tense in the reported speech without the quotes.
- 34 Option (D) is the correct answer. It is not possible to have a passive form in the past perfect continuous tense.
